Your Excellency,

I herewith officially advise you of our, "Acceptance and Application," of the Geneva Conventions of 12th August 1949, Act 103 of 1957 of the Commonwealth of Australia.

This notice is in conjunction with the notice already given to your Prime Minister on 2nd June 1978, by telegrams, followed by confirmation letter direct to your Prime Minister and also through the Swiss Federal Council.

This Convention which is also the law of your Country, covers a Group, Organization or Power, which has occupied Territory. Upon the afore notice being so given, then by the said law of the Commonwealth the said law shall apply.

I have as required notified your Prime Minister of all Ranks, and Titles appointed. The said law of the Commonwealth of Australia stipulates that respect at all times shall be given to all such Ranks and Titles as appointed and notified.

The said law also in conjunction with my appointed title holds myself responsible, for the actions of all my people whose allegiance I do have. The said law also conveys, the Duty to Govern to the occupying Power as well as the said duty to hold Court, as per the specifications contained in the said law.

The Interpretation Act of the Commonwealth of Australia, specified that where a law conveys a Power, then the Power is conveyed, it also specifies that a Duty shall be done.

The afore read in conjunction with section 28 of the Commonwealth of Australia Crimes Act, "It is an offense for anyone to hinder another persons Political duty". Plus also 30B(1) "It is an offense for anyone by speech or writing to advocate or urge for the overthrow by force of the established Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, other Country, or Organized Government, hence, it is clearly my duty to Govern and fulfill the duties which the Commonwealth laws so requires of myself. The said Geneva Convention also stipulates that the Commander in Chiefs shall communicate. As you are the Executive Officer of the Commonwealth, then the Commonwealth law of Australia requires both you and myself to communicate.

The said Geneva Convention also stipulates how any disputes shall be resolved which firstly is by notice, and then the formation mutually of a Board of Enquiry, and in all cases other than a Major Crime, (murder etc)., not before a Municipal Court.

It is therefore with all due respect of the law, which we most sincerely trust shall be mutually evident that we do look for your communications in respect to any matters which thus require our mutual attention.
